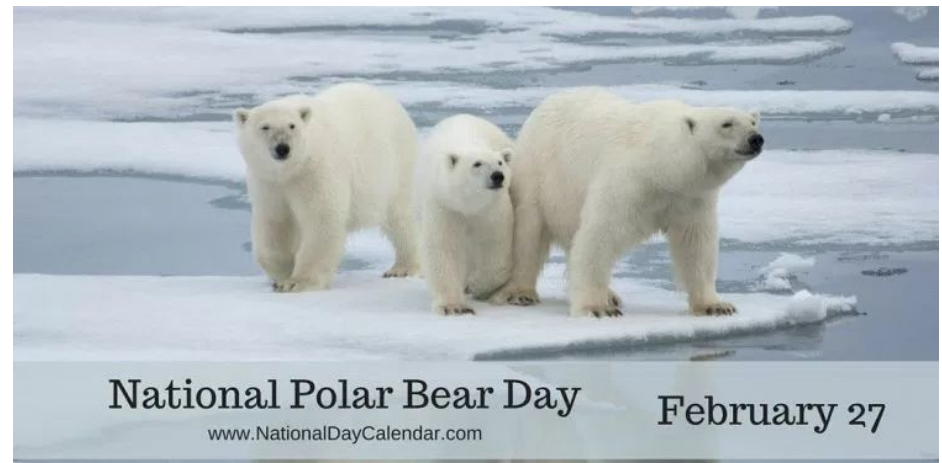

PARCC is the state testing that is required for every students beginning in 3rd grade. Our testing doesn't start until the beginning of April. More information will be sent home before then, but if you have any questions please email or call. This is the first year students take this test, so we'll be going over examples and explaining it to them.

Spelling: Syllables VCCCV. Say the words slowly while you spell them to listen for the sounds and where the syllables are.

Math: Students did well learning what variables are. We should finish up with multiplication and division and begin fractions next week. Keep practicing those multiplication facts at home.

Reading: We'll read a fun story about a man who loved rocks this week called Rocks in His Head.

ELA/Writing: Students were very creative with their Unity Point monuments last week. We'll work on incorporating adjectives in our writing this week.

Social Studies/Science: Students learned there are three types of rocks last week. We'll keep learning about rocks and fossils, and practice being paleontologists this week.
