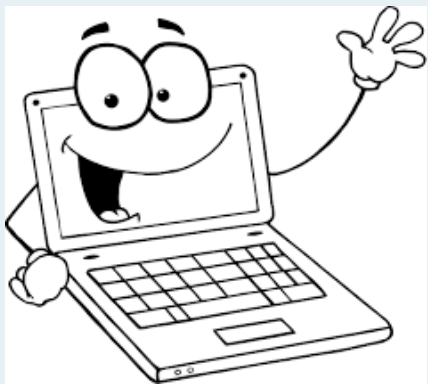

I want to welcome everyone to 3rd grade! We are going to have an exciting year. We will be getting to know each other this week, as well as learning how 3rd grade works. This is my 13th year working with 3rd graders at Unity Point, and I truly enjoy it. I believe that each student has special talents and skills which is why our class is using a “Super Hero” theme.

Learning—I focus on a group learning environment. Students will learn to work together in a variety of cooperative ways. Students will take lead roles, and even become the teachers themselves!

Communication— Weekly assignment sheets will be sent home on Mondays letting you know what we’re working on in class, upcoming dates, announcements, and any other important information. I will return phone calls as soon as possible, but emails are usually quicker as I read these at night.

Behavior—Along with following the 3 Trojan Traits, I believe in focusing on positive behavior. I use “hot tickets” throughout the day to focus on students doing the right thing, working hard, etc. Ask students about the things they get when their ‘hot ticket’ is pulled. I also use a chart for students to monitor their behavior, students can go up or down the chart. If they go down, they will lose minutes on recess so we can discuss their behavior. If the behavior is serious enough a phone call home will be made.
